

The Benefice of the East Vale and Avon Villages

Dear Friends,

How do you feel about change? Are you a big fan of new tech, ahead of the curve with wireless chargers and a phone with a folding screen – or do you find much-needed security in a world changing far more quickly than is comfortable, by doing things carefully in a time-honoured way, with tried and trusted tools and methods? My son is definitely Team Tech – but I am way behind, trailing reluctantly in his wake. I still listen to CDs sometimes, and I finally made it onto Twitter just in time to see everyone departing for other platforms (where IS everyone?)

But I do try to recognise when change needs to happen, especially when I can see that new ways of doing things can help us do a job better, or will bring a fresh viewpoint. We stopped holding Evensong services here in the Vale quite a while before I arrived (in November last year), as very few people wanted to come to them anymore. But we are holding our first "Forest Church" in a couple of weeks, where we will gather in one of the church yards, hoping -

expecting -to find some much-needed peace among the trees, the flowers and the birdsong. We will take time to feel the grass beneath our feet, the sunshine on our faces, and allow the sights and sounds around us to help us breathe freely, or just to sit, quietly, peacefully, in God's presence, and with each other. (If you would like to come to a session, please get in touch and I can send you details.)

I am also a fan of new (or new-ish!) technology when it can solve a current problem that stops us doing the things that we want to continue doing. So in our Sunday morning services, (yes we still have these in at least 2 of our churches in the Vale, most weeks), or any other services (weddings, funerals, baptisms) we often still want to sing -and while our hymns and songs are drawn from old and new material, we sometimes can't get an organist. While we would love to be able to sing along to "live" music (and if you play a keyboard, or anything else we could sing with, we would love to hear from you!) — we are able to use Bluetooth speakers and playlists on phones to enable the music to shake the aisles.

I also really love seeing "old" ideas worked out in new ways, with people bringing their own creativity and ideas to church events and special services throughout the year. We have had some really beautiful poems or other texts read alongside the Bible readings in baptisms, weddings and memorial services. Last week I watched as a bride came walking down the aisle towards me, accompanied not only by her dad – but also her (beautifully-behaved) dog who sat carefully between bride and groom, avoiding the dress and flowers, all the way through to the end.

In our changing world, where so many people struggle to get through a day, what are the things (habits, technology, people) that help make your life just that bit easier or which enable you to rise to a particular challenge? And where are the places – or the people that you can turn to when you need some peace, where you can feel welcomed, listened to, and where in turn your voice can be heard and your gifts can be recognised? I hope that anyone could find a reassuring welcome at any of our services or our midweek events, regardless of whether we are using any technology or none, whether we are inside or outside, formal in the pews or relaxing with a coffee on a bench outside in the sunshine. All are welcome in this place. God bless you,

SAVE THE KINGS ARMS

The Community Share Offer has, of 19 June, raised £99,200 from over 80 investors from within the village and wider afield. Therefore, with just over one month left to the extended closure date of 31st July, we are £100,000 short of our optimum target.

- You can help us reach this target as follows:
- If you previously pledged but have not invested please do so asap.
- If you have not pledged but are interested in investing please do so.

 If you have doubts or concerns stopping you from investing, please raise these concerns with me directly. I will answer all such queries as best I can.

We also need to broadcast our campaign to as wide a potential investor audience as possible. Share our Save the KIngs Arms campaign to your friends and families on Facebook and other social media platforms.

Investments are being held in a separate secure account. After 4 July we will contact our MP (whoever that may be) to understand the situation regarding Government support towards projects such as ours to save assets of community value by transferring them into community ownership. The more support we can demonstrate from the community itself, the stronger our claims will be. So, as the posters say, "YOUR PUB NEEDS YOU!"

Remember, if the project does not result in an offer to purchase the pub all investments will be returned in full.

Finally, can I remind all villagers that the pub is open and Dave has new menus including bar snacks and ciabatta sandwiches with curry specials on Thursday and special steak offers on Mondays.

It is in our interest to keep the pub operational as a going concern before our potential purchase. If the pub closes the fabric of the building will quickly deteriorate and make the transition period far more complex and expensive!



The rescheduled Bioblitz day welcomed some leading local specialists who spent a happy few hours investigating our Evesham Road site. I am now awaiting a report from the Project Officer, Tom Wood. One plant I found interesting is Broomrape, a parasite of clover. It is a purplish colour (no green because it does not need to photosynthesize). It's also on the Millennium Green so look it up and see if you can spot it. Quaking Grass which is so delicate and pretty and needed some spotting amongst everything else was a delightful find. There are lots or Orchids and I hope that you will take the opportunity to walk through the Orchards for a wander. One unwelcome visitor this year is the Apple Ermine Moth Caterpillar which is damaging the young trees in particular. We are hoping it won't affect the crop.

This year's Cider is now on sale and judging by the amount consumed at the D Day Commemoration is a great success! Volunteers and our last group of ramblers had a tasting session and all agreed that it is jolly good! Please get in touch if you would like a case delivered.

We have the Evesham Festival of Word Poetry in Nature walk at the end of June and a couple of school visits planned, a wedding and a couple of BBQs in July. These hardy folk were soon rewarded with sunshine and wild flower meadows as they gently descended the west side of the Ridgeway. The recent rain made progress a bit slippy but, as we climbed back up to the Ridgeway through Caldswell village, all were happy to be on tarmac.

Crossing the main A441 led us to walk down through woodland that gave open views towards Alcester. As we walked towards Coldcomfort woods the threatened rain clouds brought thunder and heavy rain, thankfully only briefly. Revived by our coffee stop, the return route followed Spittlebrook which we crisscrossed, only once requiring use of stepping stones as a ford. The weather had cleared back to sunshine as we enjoyed the quiet, well managed section of the Millennium Way.

Saving the best challenge to last, the walk concluded with a very steep grass bank back up to the Ridgeway. Lovely views over the very peaceful farm land were a reward as breath was gathered to complete the climb. Who mentioned tricky styles? Impressive agility was on show where needed. Dogs were exhausted never mind the ramblers after this 3 hour outing.

We were joined by 5 others for an excellent lunch, in a dog friendly pub, that also offered great value for money. Not altogether a bad way to see part of the local countryside rarely visited.


