The Neighbourhood Development Plan is now in the hands of the Inspector. It is hoped that the inspection will be complete by mid-September when the Council can hopefully prepare for the Referendum. All parents are reminded that the play equipment on the school playground is open to students of Cleeve Prior 1st School or children accompanied by an adult outside of school hours. It is the adult's responsibility to assess the suitability of the equipment for the child's age and ability. Please report any potential problems with the equipment to the Clerk.

The Council would like to remind parishioners that the wharf and play equipment are facilities for the parish that are used at one's own discretion and risk.

📕 Safe Cycling

Keeping everyone safe on our roads and pavements in Cleeve Prior is a key priority for

the Evesham Rural North Safer Neighbourhood Teams and we are committed to reducing the numbers of people injured in collisions.

We are receiving an increasing amount of reports of people cycling on pavements that are designated for pedestrians only. This clearly poses dangers to both pedestrians and the cyclists.

Cyclists should:

Use cycle lanes wherever they are available;

Not ride on pavements or footpaths unless there are signs permitting this; Be as visible as possible when cycling on the road. Ride well clear of the kerb and wear bright clothing - high visibility and reflective clothing will ensure you can be seen in daylight and at night.

If you are stopped by police for cycling on a pavement you could be liable for prosecution in a court that could result in a fine up to ± 500 together with the costs of any damages caused.

Money buys Minutes when it really matters

Whoever you are, or whatever you are, you do not know when you or your loved ones will need the Air Ambulance. Their response can be the difference between Life and Death.

In the last fourteen years there have been over 28,300 missions giving the seriously injured or ill a chance of survival when previously there would have been no hope at all. The local Air Ambulance covers nearly 4,000 square miles across the counties of Warwickshire, Northamptonshire, Derbyshire, Leicestershire and Rutland. Every time an Air Ambulance helicopter takes off with a pilot, a doctor and a critical-care paramedic, it costs £1,700 per mission, with an average of 6 missions a day.

On a recent visit to the Warwickshire HQ, I found that not a penny is ever wasted. The small room where the crews stand by (3 minutes from call-out to take-off), contains just sparse sitting space, with one wall completely taken up by a map of the counties covered. Attached to the map is an impressive example of World War II technology – a piece of string with a magnet on one end and a bent nail on the other, which very accurately indicates the site to be visited and the journey time (on average, 13 minutes).

The Air Ambulance Service receives no Government funding whatsoever and is reliant on donations. It is up to us to keep these Guardian Angels flying.
