

Our Autumn season of talks got off to a good start when Brian Ellis gave us a very interesting practical demonstration on "Roots and Shoots". We learnt how to extend our plant collections by the process of splitting. Brian demonstrated by using a large number of plants including Agapanthus, Sedums, Heleniums, Geraniums.and Tiarella, which he then offered to our members to take home and repot.

Most plants are best split in the autumn with the exception of grasses and crocosmia, for which the spring is a more suitable time. We also learnt the benefits of the Chelsea Chop!

Finally we were able to browse the large collection of plants for sale from Avondale Nurseries which Brian brought with him.

We now look forward to our October meeting when, as always new members and guests are most welcome.
