On 7 February we held our second AGM which was very well attended. All of the Officers stood again with the exception of our Secretary, Jan Arkell. Thanks to all her efforts in creating and installing the necessary systems on line, we are now very well set up for future years. Jan was presented with a bouquet of flowers and assured us she will still be a part of the Club. Julie Freeman was unanimously voted in and welcomed as our new Secretary. It was pleasing to confirm the subscription would again remain unchanged at £15 a year for members and £4 per meeting for visitors. A further benefit will be that the plant table now becomes an exchange or help-yourself system, which we hope will encourage members to contribute any of their unwanted plants.

Following the AGM Glyn Jones, who joined the Shakespeare's Trust as Head of Gardens in February 2016, after 17 years as Head Gardener at Hidcote Manor, treated us to a very entertaining presentation. We were taken on a journey through the five gardens in and around Stratford, which include New Place, Anne Hathaway's Cottage, Halls Croft, Mary Arden's, and of course Shakespeare's Birthplace. Glyn described the situation he found on taking over, and his enthusiasm was evident when he explained the changes and improvements he is planning to implement. He is setting out to create separate style and atmosphere in all the gardens, some of which are already in progress. If you haven't been to any of the properties recently they are certainly worth a visit. An annual ticket is available for all five properties and this gives you as many visits as you like and offers savings against individual visits.

Our next meeting will be on 7 March and, as always, we look forward to seeing Members and Visitors, together with any unwanted plants.

The Vale Landscape Heritage Trust is running a First Aid course on Sunday 4 March. This is a full day course, free to CPHT volunteers, who just need to bring their own lunch. If you are interested please contact me to see if there are still places available.

It's been a very wet start to the year but Volunteers have been kept busy pruning fruit trees, cutting up logs and carrying out general site maintenance. Preparation of the site of the low mound between ponds has begun, before seeding can take place. Stone picking was likened to penal servitude by volunteers (I am wondering how they knew what it was like!!).

Now is the time of year when the top orchard and wood start to put on their spring show with a carpet of primroses – so why not wander up there for a look. You can always park the car at the Barn. En-route if you are lucky you may spot the Green Woodpeckers in the orchard. If you are a bird lover or in search of a little solitude, bird life in The Sanctuary is seeing increased activity since the pond was cleaned out last Autumn by Peter Howe and Sally Harper. Peter has suggested that visitors to the Sanctuary could bring nuts to fill up the feeders especially in this cold weather.

Logs are still available to *keep the home fires burning* and stock up for next Winter. £40 a builder's bag including a bag of kindling!

Cleeve Stone is a compilation booklet by Don and Lin Warren illustrating the importance of quarrying Cleeve Stone over the centuries and the legacy to the village. The Compilation combines first-hand surveys, oral history and literature research to tell the story of this 200 million year-old stone and its impact on the locality. A copy of this is available to view at the Tea Shop and the Heritage Trust and if sufficient people would like to buy a copy we will make a block order. This is a very readable and instructive booklet with lots of illustrations that every household should have to show visitors.
