The Benefice of the East Vale and Avon Villages September 2018

'Taking Funerals Seriously' was a conference recently held in Worcester. For everyone who went, it made us think about death, dying and funerals - not a subject that many of us feel comfortable talking about. It can be hard to find the answers to questions that we don't want to ask; awkwardness, fear and upset can make it difficult to be able to be fully informed when we find ourselves in the position of attending or organising a funeral. The conference prompted us to write this article as a conversation-starter about this difficult topic.

Anyone living in the parish is entitled to have a Church of England funeral, regardless of whether they ever attended church or not. Whilst a 'church funeral' suggests a certain location, there is a lot of flexibility in where a service takes place; it doesn't have to be in church. It could also take place in a crematorium, at an outdoor woodland or burial site, or in a cemetery.

The clergy and other licensed ministers are experienced and well trained in pastoral ministry. When someone dies we understand how difficult this can be; we are there to support you, and your family and friends, before, during and after the funeral with compassion, fellowship and prayer, understanding your sadness and loss. We work alongside you to put together the service - each service is unique, and tailored to reflect the life of your loved one. They may include favourite or particularly appropriate tributes, poems, music, hymns and songs. Working closely with the funeral directors, we make sure everything is fitting for this final farewell.

Central to all Church funeral services is a message of hope. Recognising that while death is *an* end, we speak about God's promise that death is not *the* end. In death, there is new life in Christ. A new life that is offered to us all; every life is precious to God and, as the Bible says, there is nothing - not our actions in life, nor even death - that can separate us from God's love. Whilst it is a difficult topic to bring up, it may be helpful to you and your family to talk about what you would like at your own funeral, whatever stage of life you are at. There is a helpful website, www <u>churchofenglandfunerals.org</u> that might be a useful starting point. Any one of the Ministry team would also be more than happy to discuss things with you.

George Oakey Private S/No 30290

Grenadier Guards 3rd Btn. Died aged 28

One hundred years ago, on 25 September 1918, George Oakey became the ninth person from Cleeve Prior to lose his life in the service of King and Country during World War 1. Born in 1890, he was the son of Charles and Mary Oakey who also lived in Cleeve Prior. George, according to the 1911, census was the village carpenter, married and had four children.

George enlisted in November 1914 and was originally in the 2nd Life Guards before going over to France in August 1915. He was eventually transferred to the Grenadier Guards due to battalion losses in March 1918. The Guards were involved in the battle known as the 'Canal du Nord ' and George was in frontline duty around the village of Lagnicourt when they were hit by a German barrage at 9am. Sadly George was killed alongside two other men with a further six badly wounded.

His grave is in the Hermies Hill Cemetery in the village of Hermies in the Pas de Calais region.

Cleeve Prior Street Lights

Cleeve Prior Parish Council proposes to replace the outdated sodium street lights over the next couple of years and money has been put into the budget specifically for this purpose. There are 19 lights in total of which 16 are the responsibility of the Parish Council, the remaining 3 are owned and maintained by Western Power. The majority of the lights are on wooden columns either on a public highway or private land.

Sodium bulbs are no longer made so it is proposed to replace with LEDs. LED lighting is more cost-effective and produces minimal light pollution.

We would like to know your thoughts on street lighting in the village.

- Do you think we have too many lights?
- Would you like the lights to be on timers? The lights used to go off at midnight before being replaced with second hand lighting thirty years ago.
- Would you rather no street lighting? There are villages that prefer not to pollute the night sky, Ashton under Hill & Sedgeberrow are an example.
