

The Benefice of the East Vale and Avon Villages **May 2019**

At the end of last month, at the beginning of Holy Week, we witnessed the disastrous fire at the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris. As the roof burned and the spire fell, the residents of Paris gathered on the banks of the Seine to watch and mourn the destruction of one the most famous churches in the world. As one by-stander commented, "It's like watching the heart of Paris being ripped out".

Those watching were not just Christians, but people of all faiths and none, demonstrating the emotional power a church building can have on people from every faith background and every walk of life. This terrible event served as a dramatic reminder that church buildings have a far wider emotional connection to a community than just the worshipping congregation. They stand as places of community connection where countless generations of people have been married, have had their children baptised, and have said farewell to loved ones. They are monuments of history and tradition, connecting us to centuries of everyday life in our villages. And yet the fire at Notre Dame has also opened our eyes to how vulnerable these buildings can be.

There is sometimes the assumption that something that has stood for centuries will always be there, but the care and up-keep of our church buildings is a never-ending process. Two churches in the Benefice, St. Andrew's in Cleeve Prior and St. Nicholas' in North & Middle Littleton, are undertaking substantial repairs to secure the buildings for the use of future generations. Without the help of the wider community, these vital repairs will not be possible. If you would like to get involved in helping maintain and preserve our churches, keep your eyes open for events and fundraisers over the next few months, or get in touch with us through the website eastvaleavon.com. The subscription is £10 per year per person, with a monthly draw for a £50 prize, plus a quarterly draw for £100. Results of the draw are advertised in this Newsletter each month. The financial year starts on 1 April and our team of volunteers have started calling on current subscribers to collect the yearly payment.

Records show that there are many residents who do not subscribe, perhaps because they are unaware of the scheme or are new to the village. The finances of the Hall would improve significantly if more residents signed up, so members of the Management Committee will be calling on non-subscribers in the coming weeks to ask if they would like to take part. A worm's-eye view of bringing a garden to life

On 3 April, Jez Taylor (son of Brian and Mary of Mill Lane Nurseries) gave a very entertaining and at times hilarious talk on *A year into growing cut flowers*. Having grown up in the village, Jez then moved away to study horticulture and work within the growing industry. He now has the prestigious role of Head of Market Garden in Oxfordshire, working for Lady Bamford at the beautiful Daylesford Farm. Over recent years at Daylesford, Jez and his team have grown a vast array of seasonal fruit and vegetables, which they have sold on to the Daylesford kitchens for use in the restaurants. Many tonnes of edible produce have been grown. Lady Bamford has now set Jez the challenge of growing cut flowers for selling at Daylesford's floristry shop. Jez has therefore, described himself as having turned out to be 'just like his dad', something which Jez (in jest), said it was something he had always avoided, purely for the reason that he preferred to grow vegetables. Garden Club members all felt it was a great way to turn out!

Jez relayed funny tales of growing flowers for selling to the many Londoners who take the train from Marylebone Station for a weekend visit to Daylesford. The more chipped the plant pot was, the bigger premium the pot sold for, due to it looking more 'rustic'! Jez had brought a range of flowers and branches to demonstrate how different varieties could be grown and arranged in vases for use around the home.
