

The Benefice of the East Vale and Avon Villages

At this time of year, I would normally find myself writing about the approach of the Easter season, but this year is very different from anything else we have experienced. Part of the problem is the uncertainty around what might happen in the near future. Now that we are no longer able to gather for worship in churches, I am reminded of the words Jesus said when He summarised the Law; "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind'. This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself'. On these two commandments hang all the law and prophets". (Matthew 22: 37-40)

Jesus was teaching that these two things - loving God first and foremost, and loving our neighbours as ourselves – underpin everything that makes for human flourishing. In times when our community are shutting down in order to protect the most vulnerable, and people are self-isolating to protect themselves and their families, it is more important than ever to remember the commandment to love our neighbours. Look out for those who might be alone and can't get to the shops. Stay in touch with people by phone or text, just to let them know that people are still out there thinking of them.

And hold each other in prayer. If you have access to the internet, our new prayer booklet is available for free download from our church website eastvaleavon.com. Other prayer resources and sermons can be found on the website, and we will be adding more material as we go along. For example, we are starting to create some online services. And if you're feeling lonely and isolated, you are always free to call the Vicar anyway. The Church is still here, putting love of God and love of neighbour at the heart of our communities. Fruit and veg boxes of seasonal produce £10 and £20, They will deliver to Cleeve Prior on Monday and Thursday for the over 70's and vulnerable groups– call 2/3 days in advance and pay directly. Orders can be made for collection 24/48 hours in advance the shop is working on limited opening hours 9-1 and only 2 people are allowed in at one time. The shop has been rearranged so that there is a one- way system to stop people getting too close. Hampton Farm Shop, 01386 41540: fresh produce including fresh fruit, veg & milk deliver to Bidford-on-Avon, Minimum spend applies but they might deliver here if there is demand. Hillers Farm Shop, 01789 773057: good selection of fresh food

and cupboard staples. Phone your order and pay, then collect from a collection point – they will come and place the items in your boot.
