There is also considerable hope that if we can manage to get infections rates back under control, restrictions might be eased a bit and we can see family members and friends again. I certainly hope this will be the case – my wife and I have a newborn baby, called Ingrid, and we are hoping she will be able to see her grandparents at Christmas.

But whatever happens in the next few weeks, Christmas is not going to be the same this year. By this time of the year I am usually looking forward to one of my favourite services of the year – Christmas Carol services! Singing favourite carols with a glass of mulled wine and a mince pie is one of the best bits of my job, but this year the restrictions on numbers able to attend a church service (and the ban on singing) means that carol services are not possible. But the church is still here, and we are still making sure that Christmas is celebrated! On 6 December, the Tree of Light in Offenham will be lit up as a way of remembering those who we cannot be with at Christmas. This prayer might be useful to those who are remembering a loved one:

you know our hearts and share our sorrows. We are hurt by our parting from those whom we loved: when we are angry at the loss we have sustained, when we long for words of comfort, yet find them hard to hear, turn our grief to truer living, our affliction to firmer hope in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. Finally, Ruth and I would like to thank everyone for their good wishes on the arrival of Ingrid, especially following the loss of our first baby, Dorothea, last year. Everyone has been very kind and supportive, reflecting the wonderful community to which we belong. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus at Christmas, I hope our community spirit remains as strong as ever, especially after what has been such a difficult year for everyone. Christmas truly represents a new beginning, and I pray that God's blessing will be upon us all as we head towards a new year.


