Growing up in Derbyshire, Ascension Day was also special because we got a half-day holiday after going to church in the morning, and it was also the day the Well Dressing Festivals began. Tissington is the first of the Derbyshire villages to open this annual festival. The tradition started after another pandemic, the wells where clean fresh water is drawn were 'dressed' with bunches of spring flowers and blessed as a thank you to God for coming through the Black Death. Over centuries and revived in the 1800s it has developed into the present form of highly skilled and beautiful decorated frames covered in clay. Patterns and pictures are made up by pressing flower petals into the damp clay. As children we helped, and gradually over the years we learned all the 'tools' of this particular trade to be able to carry on the tradition.

Sadly, last year we were not able to share any time together celebrating, as events like the Well Dressings and everything else was cancelled. There has been too much heartache endured during this pandemic so, as we go forward to happier times, let us not forget to continue to be thankful for those who kept things going for us whilst we waited for better days to come.

Enjoy your celebrations when they arrive, I know I will.

Due to flood damage the Parish Wharf facilities such as the steps to the river and the seat are dangerous. Please avoid using these parts of the Wharf and any other sections deemed unsafe as determined by personal inspection. Repair of the bottom step is planned.

It is expected that another large caravan will be transported to the Traveller Site off Haywood Way in May. The transport will be much quicker if there are no cars parked on the route. With this in mind the transport company and site owner have been requested to give plenty of notice so the exact date and time can be included in the May edition of the parish magazine. The Clerk also requested the land owner to deliver flyers to the critical households. BT has been installing full fibre to Cleeve Prior homes. News from Field Barn May 2021

First of all many thanks to those of you who donated and came up to the Trust to plant snowdrops in the Top Orchard and Woodland area. We were lucky with the weather which stayed fine and the ground, despite the lack of rain, proved easy to plant in.

You will notice that we have a new logo and would like to thank Don Wilson for his artistic skills in producing the drawing of Field Barn as seen from the Old Rickyard entrance. This 250 year old Threshing Barn, build of lias stone, was originally part of Cleeve Manor Farm and in the autumn would have been full of stacks of wheat sheaves on staddle stones waiting to be threshed.

The cold weather in April may have affected pollination of the plums but we shan't know for a few weeks, fingers crossed on that one. The trees planted last March are doing well despite the hot dry spring last year; we have only lost three. There are sheep going back into Earls Lane Orchard so dog walkers are asked to be aware when walking in the adjacent Earls Lane Wood. This year's cider is proving very popular and comes highly recommended. We have just had a second batch bottled.
